## A note from the Founder

One word I would use to describe 2024 is challenging. From the outside, if you were keeping an eye on us, you would have seen great PR coverage, award wins and happy swappers and workshoppers – but the reality was unfortunately more about wondering how we'd manage financially month to month, and then overcoming crazy obstacles we never thought we'd be up against so early on.

We've changed massively as an organisation, sometimes not by plan but by necessity. The biggest change was dropping the Crumlin in our name when we had to move premises quite suddenly, uprooting ourselves from Crumlin to our new home on Thomas Street, Dublin 8. Happily, it has lead us to a place we never dreamt we'd be just one year after becoming a non-profit.

2024 was the year we made a name for ourselves as more than just a swap shop. We implemented a range of new projects including:

- Back to work programmes and placements
- A new range of workshops and events taking place across Ireland
- Supports for communities to run their own events
- Repair cafes
- Our presence at markets and upycled products
- Redistribution of clothing to those in need

40 separate partners, both public and private, helped us to do all of that.

A personal highlight for me has been having young people in for various workshops and courses, injecting humour and creativity into the place. I still think about walking into the studio one morning to a bunch of young fellas from the Youth Reach Transition centre, each one getting stuck into sewing a banner. The place smelt like a Davidoff convention, but it also felt like anything could be possible with the right supports. There's also the fact that people believed in us enough to invest in us. 44% of our income came from people paying for our services in 2024. Thank you to everyone who has engaged with us at all levels, it's been heartening to see so many faces old and new over the last 12 months, cheering us on.


Our plans for 2025 include:

Change Clothes is a community based clothing reuse hub. We're a registered not for profit CLG.

Founded in 2022 in Crumlin, we prevent clothing waste at community level before it becomes a global problem, and create opportunity and change in the process.

Our goal is to make sure second hand is community focused, fun, affordable, and social. We do this by providing reuse solutions for clothes at all stages of their lifecycle.

#### **Change Clothes for Good**

Change Clothes is a transformative programme for young people aged 18–25 who are not currently in work or education. Piloted in 2024 with thanks to support from the CDETB, young people learn practical mending and creative upcycling skills, merchandising, illustration, styling, the basics of climate change, building resilience and much more. We are currently seeking funding for an extended year long programme in 2025, but this programme can be run in a number of formats to suit the needs of any youth organisation. ## **Our Projects**

#### **Change Clothes Changes Lives**

We are currently recruiting long-term unemployed individuals to take part in a year-long Tús Scheme traineeship through the Liffey Partnership. Trainees will undertake sewing machine training and create product from waste textiles, developing essential skills and exploring their own creativity. This programme is supported by Dublin City Council as part of the Dublin City Social Enterprise Awards 2025.



#### **Camp Change Clothes**

Keep your eyes peeled for our first Easter and Summer Camps at our Thomas Street studio in 2025. We'll be offering clothing reuse courses for young people and adults alike, because creative exploration is important for everyone.



#### **Repair Cafes**

We run free repair cafes on a quarterly basis. These fun and social events are a great way to observe basic repair skills and meet likeminded people. See when our next events are here.

## Pieces of Clothing saved from landfill



According to the UK Carbon Trust, the average **carbon footprint of a t shirt over the span of its lifetime is 15kg.** 

If we say that all 10,501 items had an average carbon footprint of a t-shirt (which they didn't, a huge number of larger items such as jeans, jumpers and coats were swapped), **we have** saved some 147 carbon tonnes in just 12 months with Change Clothes.

## 2024 Highlights

#### Jan

Change Clothes held it's first sewing machine workshop instudio, going on to become a monthly event.

## April

Change Clothes launched a free tshirt upcycling resource and held a day of free workshops ro celebrate.

## July

Change Clothes was appointed as 'Sustainable Development Goals' Champions 2024-25 by the Department of the Environment, Climate & Communications.

#### Feb

We had a feature in the Irish Times that introduced us to a much wider clientele.

## May

We launched the free Swap Kit with support from DCC, ran a free programme with Rialto Youth project for Cruinniu na nÓg, and won the Emerging Category at the RDS Circular Economy Awards.

### August

We launched our quarterly, free Repair Cafes and manned a trading stand at the RDS Horse Show with support from the RDS Foundation.

## March

We launched our Annual Swap Membership, held our first €2 resale event, and held our first drive for clothing for people in need.

#### June

Change Clothes ran its first Summer Camp programme at Richmond Barracks with support from Dublin City Council Culture Company.

## September

Change Clothes Crumlin became 'Change Clothes' and moved to The Digital Hub, Dublin 8. We were also announced as recipients of the Dublin City Council Social Enterprise Award, as well as winners of the Nancy Ward Circular Economy Award.

## October

Pilot programme 'Change Clothes for Good' took place, offering young adults a practical introduction to sustainable fashion. We were featured in The Guardian in the same month.

### November

We hosted an in-house redesign thinking event for Irish Design Week and ran a 6-week programme for Youth Reach participants.

### December

Change Clothes launched the 'Community Closet' Project, providing 'free to take' clothing rails to people most in need.
